Reflection:

Older readers may remember the author Arthur Mee, who died in 1943. He was mainly a children's author. However, one of his best known works for adults was 'The King's England'. This was a series of volumes, published over quite a number of years, one for each English county. In each volume he described something about every place in that county, whether it be a city, town or village. Although his style of writing is, by modem standards, rather florid, I find these books are still useful and worth consulting.

One of the noteworthy things about these books is that he doesn't shirk writing about some of the run down and grim places in the country. He doesn't avoid the 'dark satanic mills' of William Blake's 'Jerusalem'. However when writing about unattractive places he always finds something good to say about them. There's a building or a street or a person of note who once lived there over which he waxes lyrical. He has this great ability to look for the best in everything.

That strikes me as a good habit for a Christian to develop. To look for the best in people, situations, places and things. The Quakers have a saying that 'there's something of God in everyone'. That can be rather challenging with some people, but it's a worthwhile thing to try to do. For wouldn't it be a much better world if everyone always tried to look for the best in everyone and everything?
